

# South Carolina Associated Press 2007 Legislative Internship

## WHAT IS IT?

A 14-week program for students who are aspiring print or broadcast journalists who are interested in developing and sharpening their reporting skills while learning to cover a government and politics beat at the Statehouse.

## AM I ELIGIBLE?

The internship is open to full-time sophomores, juniors, seniors and graduate students. Preference will be given to journalism majors or students with newspaper, TV or radio experience.

## HOW MANY PEOPLE ARE IN THE PROGRAM?

Two students will be selected.

## WHAT ARE THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PROGRAM?

You get to work at the South Carolina Statehouse under the supervision of the AP staff writers. You get paid. You get to cover breaking news and work on enterprise stories that may be featured in multiple media outlets. You also may be eligible to receive college credit for your work.

## HOW WILL THE PROGRAM BE STRUCTURED?

Interns will work 10-12 hours per week Jan. 15-April 20. They will need to be available during daytime hours Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

## WHAT DO YOU NEED FROM ME?

- A resume and cover letter
- Two letters of reference, at least one from a professor or faculty adviser on school letterhead
- An interview with South Carolina AP Statehouse reporter Jim Davenport
- A completed employment application
